SLAVERY AND HUMAN TRAFFICKING POLICY

The Port of London Authority (PLA) is the statutory harbour authority for the Port of London. The PLA is opposed to all forms of human trafficking and slavery and makes its best endeavours to promote sound, moral and ethical practices throughout the whole of its business.

We are vigilant to identify modern slavery or human trafficking within our supply chains, or in any part of our business, and require that our supply chain partners adhere to the requirements of the Modern Slavery Act 2015. We undertake all necessary practicable steps so that our standards are being implemented throughout our supply chain.

To achieve a high level to staff understanding of the risks of modern slavery and human trafficking, we provide information and awareness training as appropriate.

This policy has been approved by the Board of the Port of London and will be reviewed annually. It is made pursuant to section 54(1) of the Modern Slavery Act 2015. It forms part of, and should be read in conjunction with, our Slavery and Human Trafficking Statement, which can be found on our website www.pla.co.uk
