# **UPPER POOL HMS BELFAST BROW REPLACEMENT/REFURBISHMENT WORKS**

Refurbishment works will continue by contractors working on behalf of the Imperial War Museum on the HMS BELFAST access brow. These works have been extended to the beginning of May 2012.

The brow section to the ship has now been removed and there will continue to be no inshore passage of HMS BELFAST.

To indicate that there is no inshore passage of HMS BELFAST the brow will be marked as if it is a closed arch.

Arches closed to navigation will be marked in accordance with the Port of London Authority River Byelaws 1978 (as amended) namely:

- By day, three red discs 0.6 metres in diameter at the points of an equilateral triangle with the apex downwards and the base horizontal
- By night, three red lights in similar positions to the discs displayed by day.

Further details will be broadcast by London VTS on VHF Channel 14.

**Persons in charge of vessels are to navigate with particular care and proceed at slow speed when passing the works.**
